
We just got done going to our 101st convention in Wildwood and a good time was had by all. To all that help Thank You very much.

The Cathedral of the Air, located Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, NJ, was originally the idea of Reverend Gill Robb Wilson, The American Legion National Chaplain. It was approved in 1929 and completed in 1933, through the efforts of The American Legion. The undersigned members of the New Jersey American Legion Family (The American Legion, Department of New Jersey / The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of New Jersey / The Sons of The American Legion, Detachment of New Jersey) wish to express our opposition to the selling of the Cathedral of the Air. We believe this cathedral to be a historical landmark and should be preserved as such.







LEGION SILVER DOLLAR COIN AND VETERAN MEDAL SET ALMOST SOLD OUT

The American Legion JUN 17, 2019

Out of the 10,000 available, about 940 coins remain of the limited edition 100th Anniversary American Legion proof silver dollar and American Veterans Silver Medal coin set.

The set features a 99.9 percent silver medal that will only be available in this set. The front of the medal portrays a bald eagle spreading its wings as it prepares for flight, suggesting the initiative, determination and personal courage required by those who choose to serve in the U.S. armed forces. It also features five stars to represent the five branches of the military and the inscription "Honoring America's Veterans" encircles the design. The reverse of the medal depicts a field of stars symbolizing all American veterans - past, present and future. A lone incused star below the field represents a veteran who has made the ultimate sacrifice in defending our country. The absence of this star in the field conveys a sense of loss to the nation. And the inscription "Service and Sacrifice" is featured.



I am proud to report that we have exceeded last year's membership of 1786. Our Membership is at 1809, an all-time high and still the largest American Legion Post in the State of New Jersey



STRATEGIC PLANNING YOUR ROADMAP TO SUCCESS

It is great to have dreams but dreams are just dreams unless you set goals and follow a plan to achieve them. A goal is a preferred result that a person or an organization envisions, plans and commits to achieve with desired outcomes and measurements.

Developing a strategic plan takes time and resources. It requires us to focus on the mission and vision of the Post. It requires us to make a commitment to a direction that the Post's mission is dictating.

In large part the responsibility, as the visionaries of your Post, is to develop and implement the strategies and goals needed to carry out our defined mission. As such, it's incumbent upon both the leadership and members to engage not only in the strategic thinking but also in the effective execution of the process. By planning and measuring we will be better prepared to grow in a meaningful way and to reach our goals.



There are 5 key components to a powerful strategic plan.

- 1. The mission, vision and aspirations. A mission statement is our overall, lasting formulation of why we exist and what we hope to be in the future.
- 2. Our core values.
- 3. A SWOT analysis. (strengths, weaknesses opportunities and threats)
- 4. Our objectives, strategies and operational tactics.
- Our KPI dashboard for measurements and funding streams.

So, why do we need a strategy? Why take the time for planning? There are many reasons but here are just a few:

First and foremost, we need a strategy because it sets the direction and establishes priorities for our Post. The goal of strategic planning is to ensure that everyone is working toward common goals to achieve outcomes and results through organized management. It defines our organization's view of success, prioritizes the resources and focuses the energy of all involved. When that happens it strengthens your operations.

A strategic plan helps simplify decision-making. Once our plan is in place, making decisions becomes easy. Acting on new ideas or initiatives that do not follow your strategic plan become burdensome because they do not fit neatly in the already predetermined direction of your plan. They stick out like a sore thumb and are easy to identify and evaluate.

Our strategic plan will communicate our message to the membership and the community. It will effectively articulate and define our Post and its direction and make it easier for everyone to work towards the goal that they have been asked to achieve.

An effective strategic plan moves through a number of different phases. The first is to establish and clarify our mission and vision. Once the vision is clear we are ready to formulate our strategy based on all the information that has been collected and then to develop our desired outcomes. Next step is to implement the strategy and finally evaluate and control the performance.

Remember that having a vision and a plan is critical to the future of our Post. It has been said that

"A vision without a plan is just a dream. A plan without a vision is just drudgery. But a vision with a plan can change the world".




