POST 129 COMMUNITY GARDEN

There's nothing quite as satisfying as growing your own fresh vegetables in a home garden, especially if you spend a good part of your day sitting behind a desk or working indoors. It's a welcome change of pace to spend some time outdoors, working with your hands and feeling physically connected to the earth. And, although a garden can be a lot of work, it more than pays for itself in tender lettuce and juicy, homegrown tomatoes that taste far superior to anything you can buy at the supermarket.



Some communities and veterans are struggling to purchase fresh and healthy food for their families. Local food

pantries and other organizations whose mission is to provide food to those in need are seeing an increase in need and a decrease in donations. Access and affordability of nutritious foods are becoming a massive issue in our veteran community. Have you seen the price of tomatoes lately? Not to mention where they were grown and what chemicals were used to produce them.



As a veteran service organization, our post has the resources, the property and the obligation to start and maintain a community

garden for our veterans. In cooperation with the Toms River Family Health Coalition and Fulfill (formally Monmouth and Ocean County Food Bank) we have identified an area in the northwest section of the property that would be ideal for the garden.

The plan for the summer crop will consist of Eggplant, Tomatoes, Cucumbers and Watermelon. The plan for the autumn crop will be Spinach, Cabbage, Kale and Tomatoes.



The impact of a veteran community garden takes many roads. It will

allow our veterans to have access to free nutritious food options, it will improve the health of our ecosystem here on our property and most importantly it will help reduce the risk of chronic disease often found in our aging veterans. Starting and joining a community garden will help address all of these concerns.

The bad news is: Starting a new community garden can take time and a lot of effort. We will need volunteers to build the boxes and to tend the garden throughout the summer.



The good news We have is: resources the and the commitment of our partners at Fulfill for the plans,

the seedlings and the guidance. We also will be joining the Coalition in a community wide effort to increase the number of gardens here in Toms River and we will be fulfilling our mission as a Veteran Service Organization by providing healthy and nutritious food options to our veterans.

WE NEED HELP

This is your call to volunteer. We need 12 dedicated men and woman to help tend the garden. Each volunteer will be assigned one of the twelve raised planters. It will be their job to tend the box throughout the season. Planting, weeding and harvesting. The estimated time would be just two hours a week. The rewards are un-limited. You will work alongside fellow Legionnaires, Auxiliary, Sons and Riders to fulfill the mission of growing nutritious and healthy fruits and veggies and you will be sharing your bountiful harvest and new found skills with our veterans in need.



Here are some great reasons to volunteer for this project.

- It will improve your sense of community amongst the other volunteers outside the canteen.
- You will be helping to improve the dietary habits and nutrition of our veteran community.
- You will be providing free fresh foods to our veterans in need.
- Your family will have free access to the harvest.

Everyone enjoy your spring and we are all looking forward to summer. Hope to see everyone at our picnic and around the post this summer season.


