On July 20<sup>th</sup> I left for vacation in South Florida. On July 21<sup>st</sup> I met a Vietnam Veteran (Nelson Garcia) from Miami who is 100% disabled and a 4 time Purple Heart recipient who is extremely frustrated with the VA and how they have treated him. My friend and I took him and his wife out for dinner to a local restaurant to get him out of his house, which I discovered he almost never does anymore. His wife informed me that he has never talked about his time in the military with anyone. When Nelson arrived at the restaurant he was so excited about getting out of the house to meet a Vietnam Era veteran. He was so proud to be there he didn't want me to see him in a wheel chair, so Nelson walked with the assistance of a cane and struggled to walk from valet parking to our table. Once we met I welcomed him home and gave him



a Vietnam Veterans Pin and thanked him for his service and sacrifice to our Country. He gave me a hug, thanked me for my service and presented me with a challenge coin from the Army Special Forces Unit he served in. It was a very special moment for me and I believe it was for Nelson as well.

We all sat down and ordered our meals and began conversing with one another. The two ladies spoke to one another and Nelson and I spoke for the next couple of hours as he shared some of the most horrific encounters of his time in "Nam". Nelson's wife got emotional as she watched him open up to me like he's never done before.

Nelson also shared with me how he applied for a grant from the VA to purchase a van with a wheel chair lift, so he can get out of the house. When Nelson checked back with the VA 13 months later to inquire about the grant's status he learned that the VA lost all of his paperwork. He reapplied last year and has yet to hear about any progress regarding his application. Nelson also applied for a power chair from the VA and was told it would take months if he was eligible at all. I felt that as a Disabled Veteran, which I belong to Chapter 24 Ocean County, NJ, was compelled to reach out to a DAV chapter in Pompano Beach Florida and ask if they could help me to help Nelson. I spoke with Jerry Toomey of Chapter 133 and he said that he had 6 power chairs coming into their possession in a few days and would certainly help us out. On July 25<sup>th</sup> Jerry said that the chairs had not arrived yet, but assured me that they were on their wav.

I returned to NJ on August 1<sup>st</sup> and was optimistic that we would get Nelson a power chair.


On August 2<sup>nd</sup> Jerry called again to inform me that the power chairs have in fact arrived and on August 8<sup>th</sup> Rosa Payan borrowed

a pickup truck and met Jerry along with 3 others who assisted with the loading of the chair onto the truck. Later that day Rosa, with the assistance of another Vietnam Veteran (Homero) she knew delivered the chair to Nelson's home. The first thing Nelson said to Rosa is Gary here? When she replied that I wasn't he moved by her and looked outside to see for himself. He was very disappointed to discover I actually wasn't there, but quickly was distracted when he saw his new power chair that was his and not a electric scooter that was on loan to him. In no time the chair was up and running as Nelson said that he fits in the chair perfectly and won't fall out of it like the scooter.

Nelson drove the chair around in the house and looked like a child on Christmas morning with his favorite toy. He said to Rosa that after she leaves he's going to take his power chair and himself to the Post Office just down the street.

I'm very proud that with friends and Jerry Toomey of DAV Chapter 133 that we have changed Nelson Garcia's life in a profound way.

I'm proud to have served in the U.S. Air Force and even humbled by this experience of "One Veteran helping another Veteran".


