

The finance committee is responsible for directing the fiscal functions of the Post in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board, the Securities and Exchange Commission, and other regulatory and advisory organizations and in accordance with financial management techniques and practices appropriate within the American Legion.

The essential duties of the finance committee are:

- 1. Plan, develop, organize, implement, direct and evaluate the organization's fiscal function and performance.
- 2. Develop and guide the Post's long term strategic plan.
- 3. Evaluate and advise on the impact of long range planning, introduction of new programs/ strategies and regulatory action.
- 4. Develop credibility for the finance group by providing timely and accurate analysis of budgets, financial reports and financial trends in order to assist the Commander, the Board and the Trustees in performing their responsibilities.
- 5. Enhance and/or develop, implement and enforce policies and procedures by way of systems that

will improve the overall operation and effectiveness of the Post.

- 6. Establish financial transparency throughout the organization.
- 7. Provide technical financial advice and knowledge to others within the financial discipline.
- 8. Provide continual improvement of the budgeting process through education of department managers on financial issues impacting department budgets.
- 9. Provide strategic financial input and leadership on decision making issues affecting the organization.
- 10. Optimize the handling of bank and deposit relationships and initiate appropriate strategies to enhance cash position.
- 11. Develop a reliable cash flow

projection process and reporting mechanism that includes minimum cash threshold to meet operating needs.

12. Be an advisor from the financial perspective on any contracts into which the Post may enter into.

In selecting the members of the finance committee I looked for qualities within each team member that would enhance the combined outcome of the committee's work that lies ahead. Here are the competencies that I looked for:

- 1. Financial Management Experience
- 2. Post Business Acumen
- 3. Communication Proficiency
- 4. Ethical Conduct
