

Post Car Won By Post Member

The Plymouth car which the post raffled off on Monday evening, November 12 was won by Dr. Sam A. Loveman who was as surprised as anyone. Marine Sergeant William Buchmann who drew the winning number was blind-folded. All the tickets were doubly folded in the same manner. It was one of the seven or eight tickets which he had purchased to complete the books handed back with unsold tickets.

His Wife reminded him that the only other item he ever won was a ton of coal, chanced off by the post back in 1922. "That's a long time ago," says Doc!

Doc Loveman was a dentist who had his office on the corner of Main St. and Snyder Ave., the building still stands. Loveman served in WWI and was a plank owner in Post 129 helping to organize the post in 1919-1920. He served as post commander several times and as American Legion Department of New Jersey Commander and was instrumental in funding and erecting the Cathedral of the Air at NAS Lakehurst.






