As you are reading this, the wagon wheels are being made by a restoration wagon wheel specialist. They will be 52" tall to support the cannon's 2,600lbs. weight. A deposit was given to get them started, so fundraising continues. We have K-Welding making the armor plates, which are missing, to give the cannon a finished look.

The "fund jar" is still being passed around the canteen. Also, t-shirts are available at the bar to show your support (\$12.00 donation). The wheels of progress are turning and I intend to have "her" ready for Memorial Day.

MEMBERS ARE URGED TO REGISTER THEIR DISCHARGE PAPERS

Toms River—Veterans who record their military discharge papers (Form DD-214) with the Ocean County Clerk's Office are now entitled to a free photo ID card, according to the county government. "As we recognize the more than 60,000 veterans calling Ocean County home, I want to encourage each of them to use this service," said Ocean County Clerk Scott Colabella. "Any Ocean County veteran may bring their original DD-214 discharge papers to any of the three locations of the Ocean County Clerk's Office," he said.

This service may be obtained at the Ocean County Clerk's office which is located at the Ocean County Courthouse, 118 Washington St., Toms River. Or, the Southern Service Center at, 179 Main St., in Stafford. The Courthouse and Southern Service Center are open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The County Connection at the Ocean County Mall, 1201 Hooper Ave., Toms River is open 7 days per week. (One of three articles originally published) From a newspaper article dated February 17, 1945:

"Captain Irving Ostuw, one of Passaic's most decorated fliers is en route home from England after completing 110 missions as pilot of a P47 Thunderbolt Fighter. He has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with nineteen Oak Leaf Clusters, a total of 21 awards.

Capt. Ostuw, husband of Elizabeth Ostuw, has served overseas with the Ninth Air Force since December, 1943. Prior to entering the service, Capt. Ostuw was manager of 0. Jay Spread Co., Calhoun, Georgia."


To sum up: Irving Ostuw graduated from the Army Air Corps Flying Schools and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in May of 1944 He flew 135 combat missions in two tours of combat with the 368th. Fighting Group in Europe, and at the end of World War 11, he was a Captain and Operations Officer of the 396th. Fighter Squadron. He was decorated with the Silver Star, the Distinguished Flying Cross with 3 Clusters, and the Air Medal with 24 Clusters.



Veteran Marine Dennis Grail's passion for golf led him from 214 feet below sea level at Furnace Creek Golf Course in Death Valley, California — the lowest course in the world — to 9.600 feet up at Breckenridge Golf Course in Colorado. He recently reached his goal of golfing in all 50 states at a course that held a lot of meaning for the Vietnam vet-turnedlocal sports editor in Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

Grail said he was inspired after talking with a colleague who had played at 600 courses, which made Grail realize he had played at 250 courses and in 34 states — only 16 away from making all 50. When it came time to decide which course would complete his bucket list, he thought it made sense to choose one in the last state to join the union — the Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course on Marine Corps Base Hawaii.




