Saturdays have previously been Karaoke and attendance has dropped off on Saturday nights. Therefore, at the request of our patrons, Karaoke will only


be one Saturday a month and we will be booking other live acts on Saturday. Also, we are planning on having live music on Sunday afternoons now that football season is over. Stay tuned.

CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS ARTICLE X, SECTION 7

A member whose dues for the current year have not been paid by January 1st shall be classed as delinquent. If his dues- are paid on

or before February 1st he shall be automatically reinstated. If he is still delinquent after February 1st he shall be suspended from all privileges. If he is still under such suspension on June 30 of such year, his membership in THE AMERICAN LEGION shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership has been so forfeited may be reinstated to active membership in good standing by vote of the Post and payment of current dues for the year in


which reinstatement occurs. Provided, however, that the Post, Department and the National Department may waive the provisions hereof, upon payment of dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs, with reference to former members who have been prevented from the payment of dues by reason of active military service.

SYBIL LUDINGTON April 5, 1761-February 26 1893

Sybil Ludington was a heroine of the American Revolutionary War who if famous for her night ride on April 26, 1777 to alert American colonial forces of the approach of the British. Her action was similar to that performed by Paul Revere, though she rode more than twice the distance of Revere and was only 16 years old at the time of her action.

Ludington, born in 1761, the oldest of twelve children, in what was then known as Fredericksburg, and in now known as the Ludingtonville section of the town of Kent, New York. Her father was Colonel Henry Ludington, a respected militia office who commanded the 7th Regiment of the

Dutchess County Militia, a volunteer regiment of local men during the Revolutionary War. He and he wife, Abigail, ran a mill in Patterson, New York. He later became an aide to General George Washington.

On April 27, 1777, British troops raided Danbury Connecticut, which housed numerous Continental Army supplies. A messenger was dispatched to alert Col. Ludington.

Ludington's ride started at 9:00 PM and ended around dawn. She rode 40 miles, through Carmel, New York on to Mahopac, thence to Kent Cliffs, from there to Farmers Mills and Back home. She used a stick to prod her horse and knock on doors. She managed to defend herself against a highwayman with a long

stick. When, soaked with rain and exhausted, she returned home, most of her father's 400 soldiers were ready to march.

The memoir for Colonel Henry Ludington states,

"Sybil, who a few days before, had passed her sixteenth
birthday, and bade her to take a
horse, ride for the men, and tell
them to be at his house by daybreak. One who even rides from
Carmel to Cold Spring will find
rugged and dangerous roads,
with lonely stretches.

Imagination can only picture what it was a century and a quarter ago, on a dark night, with reckless bands of "Cowboys" and "Skinners" abroad in the land. But the child performed her task,

clinging to a man's saddle, and guiding her steed with only a hempen halter, as she rode through the night, bearing the news if the sack of Danbury. There is no extravagance in comparing her ride with that of Paul Revere and its midnight message. Nor was her errand less efficient than his. By daybreak, thanks to her daring, nearly the whole regiment was mustered before her father's house at Fredericksburg, and an hour or two later was on the march for vengeance on the raiders"

Sybil was congratulated for her heroism by friends and neigh-

bors and also by General George Washington. A statue of Ludington, was erected near Carmel, New York, in 1961 to commemorate her ride. In 1975, Ludington was honored with a postage stamp in the "Contributors to the Cause" United States Bicentennial series.

Sybil died in Unadilla, New York on February 26, 1839 at the age of 77. She is buried near her father in the Patterson Presbyterian Cemetery in Patterson, New York.

IN FLANDERS FIELDS POEM The World's Most Famous WAR MEMORIAL POEM By Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place: and in the sky The larks still bravely singing fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the dead: Short days ago, We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved: and now we lie In Flanders fields!

Take up our quarrel with the foe
To you, from failing hands, we throw
The torch: be yours to hold it high
If ye break faith with us who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields

Composed at the battlefront on May 8, 1915 during the second battle of Ypres, Belgium

On May 2, 1915, John McCrae's close friend and former student Alexis Helmer was killed by a German shell. That evening, in the absence of a Chaplain, John McCrae recited from memory a few passages from the Church of England's "Order of the Burial of the Dead". For security reasons Helmer's burial in Essex Farm Cemetery was performed in complete darkness.

The next day, May 3, 1915, Sergeant-Major Cyril Allinson was delivering mail. McCrae was sitting at the back of an ambulance parked near the dressing station beside the *YserCanal*, just a few hundred yards north of Ypres, Belgium.

As John McCrae was writing his In Flanders Fields poem, Allinson silently watched and later recalled, "His face was very tired but calm as he wrote. He looked around from time to time, his eyes straying to Helmer's grave."

Within moments, John McCrae had completed the "In Flanders Fields" poem and when he was done, without a word, McCrae took his mail and handed the poem to Allinson.

Allinson was deeply moved:

"The (Flanders Fields) poem was an exact description of the scene in front of us both. He used the word blow in that line because the poppies actually were being blown that morning by a gentle east wind. It never occurred to me at that time that it would ever be published. It seemed to me just an exact description of the scene."
