COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

Michael Schaffer

Brothers and Sisters:

I was working on my commander's message and in doing so trying to express myself in the need for more involvement by our membership in events and programs. I was struggling and then I received the following from Trustee, Mr. Ralf Wolf. I thanked him for this and asked if I could use it for my commander's message.

Leave No Man or Woman Behind

"No one has ever become poor by giving" Anne Frank

At the February general membership meeting at Post 129 on Church Road in Toms River, I was lucky enough to be in attendance when Commander Michael Schaffer began a discussion centered on the topic of expectations and volunteerism. It was one of the most outstanding, honest and frank directives from a Commander that I have heard in recent memory.

We were about to begin nominations for the executive team and the trustees when Commander Schaffer asked the Judge Advocate for a moment to address the membership. Here is what he said:

"If you are going to elect me again as Commander then there is something you should know before accepting a nomination. I, as Commander, will expect that each of you participate in the business of the Post and not just sign up to have your name on a letter head."

Commander Schaffer was completely clear; if anyone wanted to become a trustee or an officer under him, he was going to expect that they participate. (It was kind of being voluntold.)

His statement took me, as I am sure it took many in attendance by surprise. It was something that needed to be said, a line in the sand if you will. Commander Schaffer went on to talk about the number of active volunteers at the Post as compared to the total number of Veterans that belong to the Post. In my opinion the number of active volunteers is shameful. Post 129 has over 1600 members and you can count on only a fraction of the membership to help out.

Commander Schaffer's state-

ment got me thinking about our Military Creed "Nemo Reside" which translates into "leave no comrade behind". Or, better said, why are you not helping your brothers or sisters who are in need? Is ignoring their plight a violation of the essential promise we made to each other that we would not abandon our fellow comrades in their time of need? I don't remember any timeline being put on our pledge. I don't recall saying that if we were not in battle that all bets were off. And as a matter of fact, in my world, a pledge is a pledge and a comrade is a comrade forever.

So I say to you, the 44,000 + veterans here in Ocean County, to the veterans who can still endure, who are ambulatory and who are of means, where the hell are you? Why are you not at the door of the Commander's office asking how you can help your fellow comrades? Why have you not lent a hand since rotating out? You are needed and keeping your promise is expected.

If you were in battle and your fellow comrade was wounded, you would do everything you could to help him or her out of danger. So what makes being a civilian any different? A few weeks ago, a young family came to the Post who had just been evicted from their home. With no money, no food and no place to live they were asking for help for themselves and their two children. So I ask you, should we turn our backs on them? Do we not have a responsibility to our fellow man to offer safe harbor especially to those who put their lives on the line for us and our country?

LEGION MEMBERSHIP


Dear American Legion Member,
