For the first time since 2001, September 11th gave me something to think about other than terrible attack on Our Post hosted our country. 18 Veterans of our Military Service that were formerly POW's at the infamous Hanoi Hilton prison camp. In doing our part, the Riders along with other motorcycle groups led an 84 motorcycle escort from the Ramada Inn in Toms River to our Post for a Meet and These brave men were Greet. thanking us for not forgetting them

while they were held prisoners and for still remembering them for their service. Very humbling for all our Post members that met these great men.

On Thursday, September 12th many of our members went to 'Bike Week' in Ocean City Md. For any motorcycle enthusiast this is a great 'long' weekend.

On September 28th it was a great day to honor our fallen Veterans. 'Sgt. Major' Joe Reiher and Mike Schaffer started out the day taking their bikes to the Vietnam Memorial to honor the lone female killed in action in Vietnam. Later that afternoon Sgt. Major, Rich Gato, Ray Miller and I along with the Post color guard attended a ceremony at Central Regional High School for the dedication of Cpl Christopher Monahan on the schools Wall of Honor. Later again most of our Riders participated in Run for the Fallen. An event that I am sure that all our members are familiar with. Our Post stands out in this event every year. A day that was very worthy of our support.

On October 5th the Riders par-

ticipated in the American Legion Riders 3rd annual ride to the N.J. Vietnam Veterans Memorial. Prior to that many of us took a test ride at Downs Ford on Route 37 to participate in a fund raiser sponsored by SAL Commander Dan Curran. Good Job Dan.

Last entry for the Riders was a Poker Run sponsored by the Blue Knights XV of Monmouth County. Many of our Riders are duel members of this group. The run was started in Hazlet but the end stop was our own Post 129 and the picnic area. The proceeds of this event went to the foundation of 1st Lt. Brian Brennan. Lt. Brennan in 2008 was a victim of a roadside bombing in Afghanistan. He lost both legs, partial loss of one arm and brain damage. This 23 year old at the time of his injuries recovered enough to fight the government to stay in the service of his country. His foundation aids in assisting families such as his while the victims of such injuries try and recover. In this ride over 300 motorcycles from as far away as New York, Pennsylvania, and one motorcyclist from Florida came to this event.

It was brought to my attention that an individual came to Commander Godfrev and asked what the Riders do for our Post. This hit me personally, and I realize that many persons think of us in a negative way. After all many of us have long hair, beards, mustaches, and overall 'biker' look. The one thing that I take from knowing so many members of the Post is that the majority of its membership understands what we do as Riders representing Post 129. We honor the living as well as the deceased Veterans of our Country in the best way we know how.




