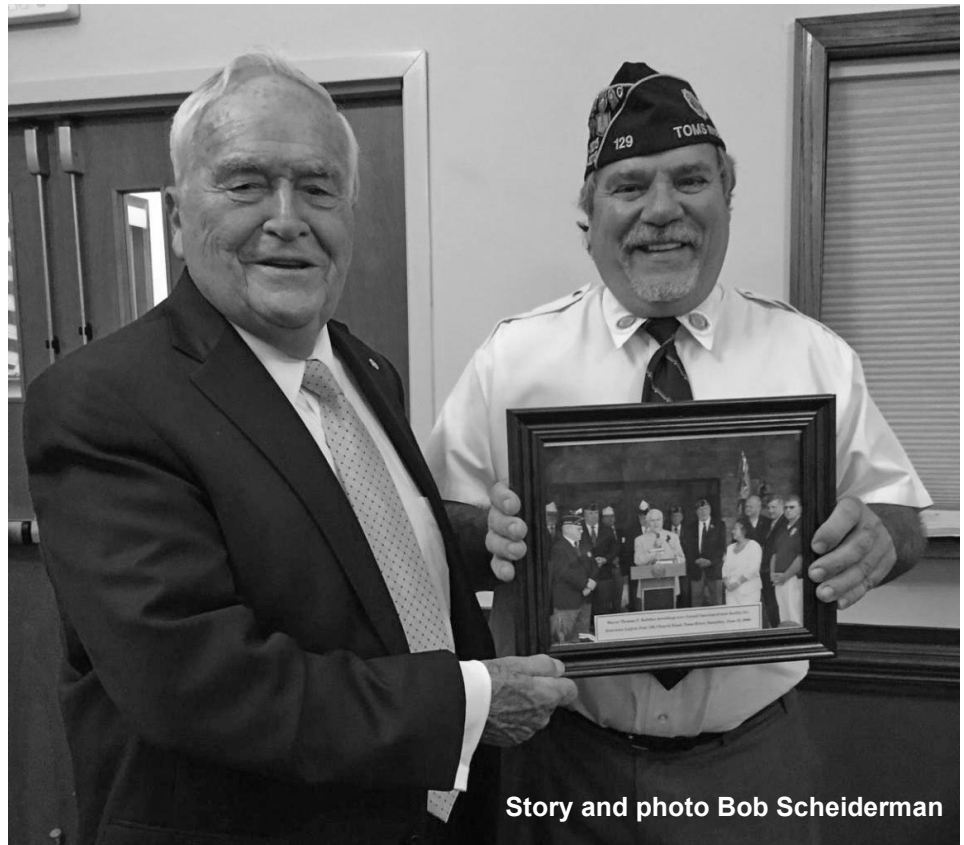
are invited back to the post for refreshments.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

The following proposals have been approved by the by-law committee and the executive board. In accordance with "Article XX Amendments" are hereby submitted to the membership for approval at the Nov. 2nd 2015 General Membership meeting.

CHANGE #1

The proposed amendment changes will expand the candidate pool for the office of commander, candidates with business experience, and various specialties; this will bring their expertise to aid in the operation of the post.

Existing Article:

Article IV Nominating Committee, section #3

Qualification for the office of commander shall be Two (2) years in office as a Vice-Commander, Adjutant, finance Officer, or any combination Thereof and successful completion of American Legion college, Basic, and Advanced or the on-line course. Must be complete prior to taking office.

New Article:

Article IV nominating Committee, section #3

Qualification for the office of commander shall be One (1) year in office as a Vice-Commander, Adjutant, finance Officer, or any combination Thereof and successful completion of American Legion college, Basic, and Advanced or the on-line course. Must be complete prior to taking office

Add on: new section #4

The nominating committee will review the Legion Qualifications plus the professional history of all of the Candidates. They will evaluate personal experience, personality, the ability to deal with public and professional issues, and make quick decisions under pressure.

CHANGE #2

The amendment proposes the change the time in service to the post qualification from twenty (20) years to eight (8) years, and the active provision from ten (10) years to eight (8) years. This change will also expand the candidate pool and provide incentive to the membership.

Existing Article:

Those eligible for nomination to Honorary Life Membership shall be members whom have served For 20 consecutive years in the George P. Vanderveer Post 129 of the American Legion and shall have been Active at least 10 of those years. Said Member shall Have held various offices and chaired and worked on various committees. The qualifications shall be reviewed by the Life Membership Committee and the The decision of the committee shall be final.

New Article:

Those eligible for nomination to Honorary Life Membership shall be members whom have served For 8 consecutive years in the George P. Vanderveer Post 129 of the American Legion and shall have been Active at least 8 of those years. Said Member shall Have held various offices and chaired and worked on various committees. The qualifications shall be reviewed by the Life Membership Committee. The decision of the committee shall be final.

The Life Membership Committee will remain as in Section 1; will consist of the post life members in good standing.

CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

Message from Rev John Washington Inzer at the 1919 caucus at the formation of the American Legion

At the May 1919 St. Louis Caucus, where hundreds of World War I veterans gathered to establish the purposes and principles of the newborn American Legion, there was some grumbling. "The inability to come to consensus on critical issues they threatened the very existence of the new organization.

At that formative moment in the organization's infancy, Rev. John Washington Inzer, a Baptist minister from Texas and a former Army chaplain, stepped up to the podium and told the Legion founders about a vision of the future he had.

"While you were deliberating here these past two days, some of you only thought of this hour and this moment. But gentlemen, I had an eye cast into the future, and I was dreaming dreams and seeing visions of the years that are to come and the wonderful work, the wonderful influence, and the mighty power that this organization is going to have and exert upon this nation and upon the whole world...

"If you can only think about this Legion... as the jewel of the ages, I believe that is the best interpretation I know. I cannot say anything greater than this: I believe God raised up America for this great hour; I can say that the strong young men of this time is to be The American Legion in this country and in the world."

Rev. Inzer's message brought the veterans in St. Louis together so they could draft and agree on a constitution that would serve veterans, military personnel, families and communities for nearly a century.

It is amazing how his vision for the legion has come to fruition and we are a stronger organization then even he imagined.

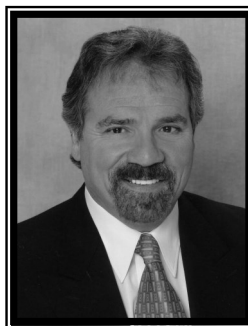
