COMMANDERS MESSAGE





I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.



The Pledge of Allegiance was written in 1892 by Francis Bellamy. The original Pledge of Allegiance was published in the September 8th issue of the children's magazine, The Youth's Companion, to celebrate the 400th anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in America. The pledge was first recited in unison in the public schools on October 12, 1892.

The Boston Light was the first light station established on the North American continent. The light was lit for the first time on September 14.



1716. A cannon was America's first fog signal. The Boston Light was destroyed in the Revolution and rebuilt in 1783. The Boston Light is also our only lighthouse that still has an official keeper.


