SERVICE OFFICERS REPORT

Brothers and Sisters,

At the last Executive Board meeting, I was not present as I was in Florida celebrating my daughter's 30th birthday, I was criticized for not doing my job by a fellow board member.

So, to answer my critics, here is what I have been doing since the last issue of the SOUNDOFF. Just a note in addition to being a past Vice Commander, a two-time Past Post Commander, Post Chaplain, Post Service Officer, Post Legion Rider Chaplain, I am instructor at Legion College, I am also the State Chaplain for 300 Posts and 40,000 members. I get multiple phone calls, texts, and emails weekly to assist around the state. I also have received phone calls from Congressman Kim's office to assist with PTSD sufferers around the state. I am also on the Board of Directors of the Military Support Alliance working to assist warriors stationed at M.D.L.

I received a call form Jennifer Garcia, Social Services Counselor, at Brick V.A. Clinic at 5:00pm that she had a 94-year-old WW2 vet who was being evicted from his place of residence I drove to Abescon and paid for his room then called Jenifer told her the conditions he was living in, he is now in the Vineland Home.

At our last General Meeting Finance Officer Ralph Wolff and I explained about the Food Insecurity issues on M.D.L. I asked for help to receive and deliver food to active-duty families in need, only 1 board member, Pete Chafitelli, volunteered time and his vehicle, I had to reach out for active-duty warriors to come to the post to pick up food. In addition, Navy Chief Tom DeViccaro showed up on 1 hours' notice to help finish a

vital delivery. To date there has been 7 tons of non-perishable goods, 600 boxes of Girl Scout cookies delivered to the food pantry. Through donations we have delivered \$2,000 worth of gift cards to help with supplemental purchases that are not covered by food stamps. Through donations of members, Michael and Dolly Johnson, we have purchased and delivered to service carts to aid with the distribution. I have personally made 12 trips to M.D.L. to drop off food and supplies. Using my contacts, we have received over 2 tons of food from the Lacev Vet Works, we have also received donations of personal care items from I.B.E.W.400. Anyone who would like to step up and help would be appreciated.

I participated in 4 Memorial Day events and did not see any members of the board at any of the events, only those who were participating. I attended 3 funerals, 2 memorial services, one at the Locustwood Memorial Park in Cherry Hill and one at the Ocean County Memorial cemetery, across the street, again only those participating were in attendance. I offered a Memorial Day prayer at the Sons of the Legion Pig Roast. I participated in the Memorial Day Service in downtown Toms River, again only those participating was in attendance.

I spent 6 days attending, at my own expense, the State Convention in Wildwood, participating in the ceremonies to honor new commander Dan Dunn and to celebrate the service of our past commander Bob Newall's two-year tenure, first ever!

Since March 15th, 2020, I have sent out an evening prayer, every night, over 400 prayers, that at this point with people that are for-

made a beautiful wreath (on behalf of Post 129) which was brought to the Service. Everyone was invited back to The Post for some gathering time.


Our Unit has begun having *In Person* Meetings again. We don't meet in July. So our next meeting will be Monday, August 9th at 7pm in the hall.

FINANCE OFFICER REPORT

OPINION

Before going into the bimonthly news of our financials, I would like to take a moment to congratulate our new commander Pete Chafatelli and all the incoming officers. Also a big thank you to our past commander Ed Rustler for his leadership during the COVID Pandemic.

The unprecedented pandemic was extremely challenging for all, but now that it is officially over, our incoming leadership must be up to the challenge. Many areas of our have been forever culture changed by the Pandemic. Taking a breath to assess those changes is a good way to start. In the words of Wayne Gretzky "a good hockey player plays where the puck is. A great hockey player plays where the puck is going to

be." Stopping to assess where the puck is going to be is what I call great leadership.

Our new leadership must involve more people using the resources of the entire Legion family. Identifying decision makers, creating a forum for rapid debate and clarifying the decisions that are made within will be one of the most difficult challenges going forward. It is up to all of us to help this new team facilitate those changes and help point the Post in a forward direction.

Almost anyone can manage, because management is about persuading people to do things they do not want to do. Leadership however is about inspiring people to do things they never thought they could. Our post pandemic team must possess the qualities of awareness, vulnerability, empathy, and compassion along with integrity, accountability, resilience, vision, influence and positivity. FINANCIALS

July is the beginning of our fiscal year and that means there is lots to do when it comes to the planning and budget. Our "Strategic Plan" was a three year plan that was disrupted due to the COVID shutdown. Now that our Post is fully open, it is time to review and revise the plan. those of you not familiar with the strategic plan, it is our road map for the future. Prioritizing the order in which we will address the needs of our Post in conjunction with the four pillars of the American Legion. We hope to present the plan to the membership in August.

And then there is the budget. The budget is an estimation of revenue and expenses over a specified future period of time. Basically the budget is a financial plan for the year and is used to track our progress and enhance the strategic plan. We expect our budget to be \$1.3 million again this year.

VICTORY GARDEN

Speaking of green, the garden is growing again this year. With the help of a grant from the TRFHSC and the tenacity and ingenuity of our soon to be Eagle Scout, Rafael Gonzales and his family, our garden has expanded its growing area with-in the compound by adding above ground box's around the perimeter. There is also a new greenhouse, complements of Fulfill nicely hidden on the far side of the compound. This greenhouse will enable us to start our plants sooner in the spring and expand the variety of vegetables that are offered.

I would like to also mention the two people who have been the lead on the garden: Chetra Kotvas and Pat McWilliams. Both have worked together to design, plant and harvest thus far this year. There is no other word that I can describe their work other than OUTSTANDING!

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
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
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
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
