MEMBERSHIP MINUTE

As we start another year, I hope everyone had a joyous and blessed holiday season and that this new year will be a safe and healthy new year for all.

I wanted to thank all the members that have sent in their 2022 dues. Your support helps keep us a strong voice on Capitol Hill to address veteran's issues and to keep the VA doing the right things for our veterans. Just a reminder, our membership year starts on July 1st. All members should have their dues paid by February 1st.

Article x, Section 7 of our Bylaws states.

A member whose dues for the current vear have not been paid on or before January 1st, shall be classed as delinquent. If his or her dues are paid on or before February 1st, they will be automatically reinstated. If any member is still delinquent after February 1st, membership shall be suspended from all privileges. If a member is still under such suspension on June 30th of such year, their membership in the American Legion shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership has been so forfeited may be reinstated to active membership in good standing by vote of the post and payment of current dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs. Provided, however, that the national department may wave the provisions hereof, upon payment of dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs, with reference to former members who have been prevented from payment of dues by reason of active military service.

So please send in your dues to support this great organization. Remember we are "Veterans Strengthening America." "We cannot do this alone. We need your help to support all the great programs that the American Legion does to support our veterans, their families, and the community in which we live.

By keeping our membership numbers up, we will continue to have a strong voice in Washington and on Capitol Hill to address the needs of our veterans. As you know, membership is the life blood of this great organization. As we enter another year of service to or communities, state & nation, let's keep our legacy moving forward. This year please remember buddy check and reach out to our members that we have not seen in a while and give them a call to see if they are okay, or if they might need anything or just to offer words of encouragement during these trying times. LET'S RIGHT THIS WRONG FOR WWII VETERANS

Dear American Legion Family Members and Friends,

It's disheartening to know there are still World War II veterans who do not have access to VA benefits. The American Legion is fighting to correct this lapse with legislation pending in Congress. JOIN OUR AC-TION CAMPAIGN: WRITE YOUR REPRESENTATIVE NOW.

Our World War II veterans halted the spread of tyranny, securing our democracy for generations to come. As of last month, fewer than 240,330 WWII veterans remain and hundreds pass away every day.

Of those still living, not all of them receive the VA health-care services they earned through their service. As a grateful nation, we must fulfill our promises to the Greatest Generation to ensure they receive all the benefits they deserve.

To rectify this issue, Rep. Josh Harder, D-Calif., introduced H.R. 5562, the WWII means test bill. The legislation would exempt WWII veterans from the means test needed to receive VA health-care services. Robert Menendez, D-N.J., has supported these efforts by introducing S.1040, the Senate companion to this bill.

The Senate bill has 10 bipartisan cosponsors while the House version has three. But little progress has been made in the past few months.

Time is literally running out for these veterans. It is critically important that one of these bills is enacted into law as soon as possible. The American Legion vociferously supports this legislation.

Congress has been down this road before. In 1996, the Veterans Health Care Eligibility Act exempted all veterans who served during the Mexican Border Period and World War I from the means test required to enter the VA health-care system.

Let's do the same for our World War II veterans before it is too late.




