AMERICANISM COMMITTEE NEWS



The ritual team has been busy again since the first of the year preforming seven rituals/memorial services. I have always said this is the most important thing we do. Just since the last SOUNDOFF we have delivered 17,000+ pounds of food to M.D.L. I am averaging fifteen trips per month and the need is increasing.

Shortly we will be opening a pantry at Earle N.W.S. I hate to beg but, I know everyone who gets this message has ability and means to have three meals a day, how about skipping one meal a

week and donating something to the Food Warrior Project. I know food prices are going up for everyone which puts more strain on those with food issues, <u>PLEASE</u> <u>HELP.</u> Let us serve those who are serving our country.

When we go about our daily routines, we always have options in our life, lift up...tear down, praise...humiliate, feed...starve. How you sum that up or explain that to your children or even people you have to deal with every day, I have found this short Cherokee story may give you a little guidance in managing the internal battle between good and evil...

Two Wolves is a Cherokee Indian legend and illustrates the most important battle of our lives – the one between our good and bad thoughts. Here is how the story goes:

An old Cherokee is teaching his grandson about life. "A fight is

going on inside me," he said to the boy. "It is a terrible fight, and it is between two wolves. One is evil – he is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego."

He continued, "The other is good – he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith. Auxiliary Gratitude Purse Project After Action Report

The Unit's original request for eighty-five purses and fifteen men's wallets resulted in the Unit receiving 489 items from, ALA members, AL members, other community organizations, friends, and family members. We distributed these donations as follows:

Fort Dix received 101 purses to female military spouses and active-duty soldiers. Fifteen wallets to male military spouses and active-duty soldiers. McGuire AFB and Lakehurst Naval Base received fifty assorted handbags for their on base Thrift shops. The



Thrift Shop revenue provides opportunity for additional recreation outlets for the families residing on or near the Base.

Ocean County College Veterans Resource Center received fifty-two tote bags and female hygiene items. Harbor House received sixteen shoulder bags and female hygiene items. Providence House received fifty assorted handbags, and diaper bags, packaged goods, and toys for children.

The Ocean County Library Prom Dress Giveaway received 39 evening bags and four pairs of evening wear shoes. This is a free program for eighth graders, juniors, and seniors in high school.

The Atlantic City Regional Stand Down will receive 25 hand-bags for the anticipated 20+ female veterans expected to attend.

Toms River Code Blue received twenty assorted handbags and diaper bags.

Fifty assorted handbags were donated to two (2) local houses of worship for their young parishioners, twenty-five are set aside for game prizes during the Unit's weekly visits to local nursing

homes. Eight handbags were donated to the Goodwill.

With the assistance of 18 ALA Unit 129 members, each handbag was examined, and given the ok to give as a gift.

This project started as a small gesture of gratitude to Military spouses. It turned into a Love of Community Project.

Thank you to the Post, SAL, and Rider Family members who also assisted with this endeavor.
