   They fear loss of their job, think they can handle their situation themselves, or don't think others can understand their situation.
  - The American Legion is activating a national ad campaign to destigmatize mental health issues. Make it okay for veterans to ask for help.
- Family members may be the first to recognize the signs that their veteran needs help, but they
  may lack the knowledge of how to approach the situation.
  - The American Legion will increase peer-to-peer education and resources for local communities. (Example: Buddy Check)
- There are several innovative programs either funded by the government or private nongovernmental organizations that help veterans in crisis, but they often lack funding or broadbased visibility. (Example: Digital Therapeutics, One More Day)
  - The American Legion has begun exploring ways to help these organizations amplify their efforts, in turn helping save more veterans.
