# MEMBERSHIP MINUTE


As we start another year, I hope everyone had a joyous and blessed holiday season and that this new year will be a safe and healthy new year for all.

As of December 14, 2022 we have 1167 paid members at 70.64%. We have 485 more to go to hit our goal of 1652. Please send in your dues. There are a few ways to do this. If you go to legion.org you can pay your dues on line and receive your membership card within a few days, or mail to the post.

I wanted to thank all the members that have sent in their 2023 dues so far. Your support helps keep us a strong voice on capitol hill to address veteran's issues and to keep the VA doing the right things for our veterans. Just a reminder, our membership year starts on July 1<sup>st</sup>. All members should have their dues paid by February 1<sup>st</sup>.

# ARTICLE X, SECTION 7 OF OUR BYLAWS STATES

A member whose dues for the current year have not been paid on or before January 1st, shall be classed as delinquent. If his or her dues are paid on or before February 1st, they will be automatically reinstated. If any member is still delinquent after February 1st, membership shall be suspended from all privileges. If a member is still under such suspension on June 30<sup>th</sup> of such year, their membership in the American Legion shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership has been so forfeited may be reinstated to active membership in good standing by vote of the post and payment of current dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs. Provided, however, that the National Department may wave the provisions hereof, upon payment of dues for the year in which reinstatement occurs, with (continued page 2)

# **CHAPLAINS REPORT**

The months of October, November and December have been outstanding for the Food Warriors. We have raised over \$11,000 and we have delivered over 23,000 lbs. of food.

I had two ride-a-longs to visit the program, PDC Ray Miller and Post 348 Adjutant Kerri Long. They both helped unload the truck at the warehouse, and then to the pantry to see the operation. In addition, Kerri accompanied me to the commissary where we picked up a \$3,100.00 order with a \$300.00 discount.

With the help of my fellow food warrior Mr. Ralph Wolff, the Post 129 finance officer, we delivered 2,100 lbs. of food from the FUL-FILL Food Bank.

On November 17, 2022, there was a distribution to 150 active-duty families of everything needed to prepare a complete Thanksgiving dinner, from the turkey, to stuffing, mashed and sweet potatoes, string bean casserole, and pumpkin pie fixins. There were many tears of joy and prayers. A most amazing day!

During the holidays, the donations are always wonderful, and I could not be more thankful, but the need remains the same and the donations slow down after the first of the year. Please keep in your heart and mind these warrior families and if you would like to donate or organize a food drive, please contact me.

In November I met with the new Salvation Army Major, Jeffery Basset, he has blessed us by coming on board as the keynote speaker for the 4 Chaplains Ceremony on Feb 5<sup>th</sup> at the Chapel of the Air at 2:00 p.m.

I attended a veteran homeless seminar in Atlantic City hosted by the DMAVA N.J. This is where I met the national policy manager and discussed food insecurity on the base now called the JOINT BASE – MDL FOOD CRISIS. Food insecurity in the active-duty military is now being considered a matter of National Security by American Legion National Headquarters.

November 5<sup>th</sup> I was blessed to do the invocation and benediction for the National President of the Auxiliary at the New Jersey Vietnam Memorial and Museum.

Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup> I did a live interview about food insecurity and attended the Ocean County College Veterans Day event. On the 11<sup>th</sup> I attended the Veteran's Day events at the Post and the parade.

On November 13<sup>th</sup> I was invited to attend the Veteran's Day luncheon at Post 348, they started a food drive and made cash donations. To date over 2,000 lbs. of food.

On Monday, November 14<sup>th</sup> with the help of Commander Barry of Post 504, the Christa McAuliffe middle school in Jackson held a food drive and collected 1365 lbs. of food. Kids helping kids. Outstand Commander Barry, thank you!

On Wednesday, November 16<sup>th</sup> I was invited to participate in a veterans townhall held by Congressman Kim.

Saturday, December 3<sup>rd</sup> attended the DEC meeting in Trenton at the War Memorial.

On December 17<sup>th</sup> I will be offering the opening prayer for Wreaths Across America at the Riverview Cemetery.

I was also involved with Mr. Greg Wareham, Your Mortgage Guy, with the production of a 1-hour Podcast about military food insecurity, along with Charline Neigel of Keller Williams Reality, who sponsored the program.
