Post 129 Recreation Center and Video Streaming Center

In the past 10 years, reports estimate that 17% of the warfighters returned from Iraq and Afghanistan with PTSD, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. Many are even beginning to recognize that PTSD is actually an injury as opposed to a disorder. Therefore I will refer to it as an injury and use the acronym PTSI.

Because of the sheer number of veterans returning with this injury and no clear-cut way to treat it, many are left to struggle on their own or become subjects of the VA doctors to experiment with an array of medications and treatments that for the most part take years to find the right combination to effect help.

Because of our lack of understanding, viable treatments, and therapeutic outlets, many of our warfighters become severely depressed. Mission 22 estimates that right here in the United States, 22 veterans take their own life each day.

It is becoming well-documented that playing video games has helped veterans develop coping strategies to manage their physical and psychological stressors. Much like the veterans who play some type of instrument, playing video games gives them some relief from their anxiety, if only for a few hours. The avatars they create become an extension of themselves or someone they wished to be which helps in the reduction of stress, depression, social anxiety and to some extent substance abuse and personality disorders.

Your Post 129 has over 300 members whose average age is 37 years old. We also have a



1400-square-foot room (the basement) that is underutilized and is being considered for the installation of the video center. See pic above.

The American Legion has begun to partner with other groups (Regiment) (Stackup) that offer team building and tournaments in the video gaming arena, making this kind of endeavor a helpful and acceptable activity for our younger veterans.



New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs

New lifetime pass available for Military Veterans and Gold Star Families to access public lands Starting on Veterans Day, veterans of the U.S. Armed Services and Gold Star Families can obtain a free lifetime pass to more than 2,000 federal recreation sites spread out across more than 400 million acres of public lands, including national parks, wildlife refuges, and forests.

"We have a sacred obligation to America's veterans. This new lifetime pass is a small demonstration of our nation's gratitude and support for those who have selflessly served in the U.S. Armed Forces," said Secretary Haaland, whose father served during the Vietnam War. "I'm proud the Department of the Interior can provide veterans and Gold Star Families opportunities for recreation, education and enjoyment from our country's treasured lands."

"Our national forests and grasslands represent so much of the beauty of the nation our brave service members have sacrificed so much for," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. "Though they can never be fully repaid, by connecting the families of the fallen and those who served with

these iconic places, we can, in a small way, say thank you."

"The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and our federal teammates are proud to honor our veterans with free lifetime access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas across the nation," said Lt. Gen. Scott Spellmon, Chief of Engineers, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. "This is a small token of appreciation for veterans who have bravely dedicated their lives to defending our freedom."

"This pass conveys our immense gratitude and respect for those who have given so much," said National Park Service Director Chuck Sams. "As a veteran, I know firsthand the many sacrifices that members of the Armed Forces and their families have made in service to our country, and I am thrilled that Gold Star Families and military veterans can now enjoy lifetime access to national parks and other public lands."

Each lifetime pass covers entrance fees for a driver and all passengers in a personal vehicle (or passholder and up to three adults at sites that charge per person) at national parks and national wildlife refuges, as well as standard amenity fees at national forests and grasslands, and at lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Veterans can present one of the four forms of acceptable ID (Department of Defense ID Card, Veteran Health ID (VHIC), Veteran ID Card, or veteran's designation on a state-issued US driver's license or ID card) at participating federal recreation areas that normally charge an entrance fee. Gold Star Families obtain information, self-certify they qualify and download a voucher on NPS.gov.

The Alexander Lofgran Veter-



ans in Parks Act, passed in December 2021, authorized free lifetime access to federal lands to veterans and Gold Star Families. The new lifetime pass for veterans and Gold Star Families is in addition to the free annual Military Pass, which has been available to active duty servicemembers and their families since Armed Forces Day, May 19, 2012.

Federal recreational land management agencies offer additional lifetime passes, including a Senior Pass for US citizens or permanent residents over age 62 and an Access Pass for US citizens or permanent residents with a permanent disability. More information is available on NPS.gov.

The Interior Department and other federal land agencies also offer fee-free entrance days for everyone throughout the year to mark days of celebration and commemoration, including the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., National Public Lands Day, and Veterans Day.
