BE THE ONE

The American Legion is guided by its Four Pillars. Among those is the Veteran Affairs & Rehabilitation pillar. At its core, the Legion's mission is to enhance the well-being of America's veterans, their families, our military, and our communities through devotion to mutual helpfulness.

Today, the number one issue facing those who served is veteran suicide. Each day, no less than 17 veterans die by suicide. That is more than 6,000 each year. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults.

At its core, The American Legion has activated a national platform to end veteran suicide. The Be the One campaign will:

- Destigmatize asking for mental health support.
- Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in the local communities.
- Deploy FDA-approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support.

The stigma associated with mental health issues is a barrier to veterans seeking assistance. They fear the loss of their job, think they can handle their situation themselves, or do not think others can understand their situation. Family members may be the first to recognize the signs that their loved one needs help, but they may lack the knowledge of how to approach the situation. If you have a family member who is a veteran, The American Legion encourages you to Be the One to:

- Ask veterans in your life how they are doing.
- Listen when a veteran needs to talk.
- Reach out when a veteran is struggling.
- Pledge to Be the One at betheone.org

Members are required to show their up-to-date membership card to the Bartender or Doorman and are

required to sign in their guests into the guest book.

Our Bunker Bar opens at 5PM from Tuesday to Saturday (Closed Mondays) and 12 Noon on Sundays.

We have live entertainment every Friday and Saturday Night starting from 7PM to 10PM. On Friday and Saturday Nights last call is 11:30PM and closing time is at Midnight. Closing times vary during the week based on the weather, the amount of Members in the Canteen, etc.

When we are open, you will be served drinks by our professional bartending staff. There are no "ham and egg" bartenders in the Canteen. Robin, Lori, Danielle, Shea, Carol Ann, Rocky, Donna, Joe, Rob and Steve are always happy to serve you. They will advise you of our drink specials which are posted around the bar. We change our Specials every two weeks. Some of our drinks are exclusive to this Post. As stated before, Legionnaires may sign in 9 guests who are not Members. SAL & Auxiliary may sign in 1 guest. So, stop by with your friends and enjoy the food, the beverages and the fun.

I'm looking forward to my first year as SAL commander. We have a great group, and we will do everything we can to keep the SAL successful and, in turn, giving back to our Post.




