## FINANCE OFFICER MESSAGE

At the Height of the Pandemic, more than Half of People aged 16 and Over Helped Neighbors, 23% Formally Volunteered.

Nearly 51% of the U.S. population aged 16 and over, or 124.7 million people, informally helped their neighbors between September 2020 and 2021 at the height of the pandemic, according to the latest Volunteering and Civic Life in American research released in January.

In response to a separate question, more than 23% of people in that age group, or 60.7 million, said they formally volunteered through an organization during the same period.

Conducted by the U.S. and AmeriCorps, the 2021 data show trends in formal volunteering, informal helping, and other civic behaviors nationally, at the state level, and within the 12 largest metro areas.

The research reveals that despite the devastating impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the U.S. population continues to serve each other and their communities- giving

their time and talent to help others at a time of unprecedented need.

I tell you the above so that we will all understand that volunteers offer crucial support during times of crisis and times of peace. Volunteerism is also a benefit to the volunteers themselves as it improves their mental and physical health.

People the world over engage in volunteerism for a great variety of reasons: But with one goal, to help their fellow man. Volunteerism also forms the backbone of many national and international organizations and other civil society organizations like our American Legion Post 129.

When it comes down to it, the big question is why we are always in need of folks to help out. At a meeting the other night I watched one of our vice-commanders ask (practically beg) for volunteers to do a simple task, watch the front door. He was asking for only 2 hours of their time and no one stepped up. The shame is that everyone missed their opportunity to do something good because that opportunity was dressed in coveralls, and it looked like work. Next time, I hope you feel that tapping and be one of those 51%.

## POST 129 FINANCIALS

The hall is finished and what a fabulous place it is. One of the best things from a finance officer's perspective is that it was completed under budget. Thanks to Paul and the construction committee.

We received two grants. One from Carol Forke, who to date has donated north of sixty thousand dollars, and another grant from the state via the American Rescue Plan granted our Post \$10,000 to help with the renovation and other updates.
