

MEMBERSHIP MINUTE

Thank you to all our Dedicated Members that have sent in their dues so far. This helps us do all the important things that we do.

Fellow Legionnaires, as of APRIL 15th 2024 our membership stands at 1,471. We are at 98.85% of our goal with 18 more to go over last year's numbers of 1488. So please send in your 2024 dues. There are a few ways to do this. If you go to **mylegion.org** you can pay online and receive your membership card in a few days, or mail to the Post.

Unfortunately, American Legion at National HQ is raising our per Capita per member. We have not had an increase in our dues in six years. With the price of everything going up, Stamps, Envelopes, Paper, Ink, and office supplies we are forced to raise our dues next year starting on July 1, 2024, to \$55.00.

National has produced a threeyear membership if you wish to you can renew now before the increase and pay the old rate of \$45.00 before July 1,2024 Eliminating the yearly hassle of remembering to renew your American Legion membership by taking advantage of the new multiyear membership available to current and potential members. Legionnaires needing to renew for next year or veterans joining the organization for the first time can lock in a three year membership by visiting legion.org/renew or legion.org/join.

A multiyear membership was approved by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion during the organization's Spring meetings last May. Resolution 1: "Purchase of Multiple Years of membership approves a five-year program offering the pur-

chase of three consecutive 12month member terms at the then current dues rate."

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the National American Legion website. Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the Post level or through mylegion.org.

Renew now with a three-year membership by visiting **le-gion.org/renew**.

Save \$30:00 over the next three years. If you wait till June 1st the rate will be \$55:00 per year. Membership cards will be sent annually by the Legion Post. Those who sign up for a multi-year membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time that they have signed up for the multi-year membership.

As we get ready to close out the 2024 year on June 30th and start our 2025 membership year on July 1st please be an Early Bird and send in your 2025 Dues. This year any member that sends in their dues between July 1st and October 1st will go into a drawing for a Free Three-Year Membership for 2026, 2027 and 2028. We will be picking one lucky member at our December meeting on the 1st Monday of the month at Post 129. Remember you must be in it to win it. Any member that renews a three-year membership for 2025, 2026, 2027 as an Early Bird will be reimbursed for their 3-year Membership should they be the lucky winner.

We need your help so we can continue to help our Veterans, their Families, and the Community where we live. Please do not forget the Buddy Check by reaching out to our Legion Family and friends to see if they need any help and offering words of encouragement especially during these trying times. With the cost of food becoming extremely high these days and the price of everything on the rise we need to look out for one another. That is what we do, Veterans taking care of Veterans.




