We would like to extend our sincere gratitude to all our dedicated members who have already submitted their dues. Your timely contributions play an essential role in supporting the important work that we do throughout the year.

Current Membership Status

As of February 2, 2026, our membership stands at 1,169. This represents 85.51% of our annual goal, with 198 more members needed to surpass last year's total of 1,367. If you have not yet submitted your 2026 dues, we encourage you to do so as soon as possible.

- Mail your dues directly to the post.

According to the Legion Act of 2019, any veteran who has served at least one day of active military duty since December 7, 1947, and was honorably discharged or is still serving honorably qualifies for

membership in The American Legion.

Financial Corner

Fellow Members of Post 129,

The national economy continues to shift, with inflation easing but everyday costs still higher than many households would like. Interest rates remain elevated, which affects long term planning for families, businesses, and community organizations like ours. Even with these challenges, strong employment and steady consumer activity show that the broader economy is holding firm.

Despite these mixed conditions, Post 129 remains financially strong. Through disciplined budgeting, careful oversight, and a commitment to transparency, we've kept our operations stable and our long term goals on track. Every dollar is managed with purpose and with the Post's future in mind.

A major priority continues to be paying down our mortgage. Reducing this debt moves us closer to freeing up resources that can be reinvested directly into our mission — supporting veterans, improving our facilities, and strengthening programs across all Four Pillars of the American Legion.

At the same time, many of our veterans and senior members

are feeling the impact of higher living costs. Fortunately, there are meaningful programs available to help ease that burden. The 2026 Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) of 2.8% provides an increase in VA disability, retirement, and survivor benefits, helping offset rising prices.

New Jersey also offers several programs that can significantly reduce expenses for seniors and veterans:

- **Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement):** Helps eligible seniors and disabled residents by reimbursing them for property tax increases, keeping housing costs stable.
- **ANCHOR Program:** Provides property tax relief or direct rebates to homeowners and renters, including many seniors on fixed incomes.
- **Disabled Veteran Property Tax Exemption:** Veterans with a 100% permanent and total disability rating may qualify for a full exemption from property taxes on their primary residence.
- **Veterans Property Tax Deduction:** Eligible veterans can receive an annual deduction on their property taxes.
- **NJ Save Programs:** Offers discounts on prescription drugs, utility bills, and Medicare premiums for income eligible seniors.
- **County Veterans Services:** Many counties provide transportation, benefits assistance, and local tax relief op-

tions that can reduce monthly expenses.

In addition to state programs, veterans can stretch their budgets by using VA healthcare, reviewing insurance and utility plans annually, and taking advantage of military discount programs for groceries, travel, and home services.

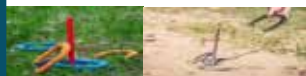

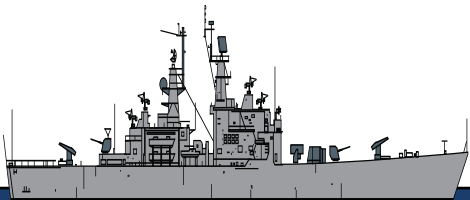
